Kualoa Regional Park is a scenic coastal park with open grassy areas, ocean access, and strong cultural roots. Camping here feels relaxed and local, but availability can change due to programs, festivals, or seasonal closures.

Kualoa Regional Park has two campgrounds: [Campground A](#), which sits on the Kāneʻohe side of the park and closes during the summer and for some programs, and [Campground B](#), which faces Mokolīʻi (Chinaman's Hat), stays open more often, and is located next to ancient Hawaiian fishponds where fishing can be good.

Activities

Beachgoing, fishing, paddling, sightseeing, and cultural events.

Facilities

Campsites, picnic pavilion & tables, restrooms, showers, trash cans, and water fountains.

Prohibited

No motorized vehicles or ATVs, no pets, no smoking, and no dumping.

Camping Rules

Max 10 people per campsite, city campgrounds closed Wednesdays & Thursdays, gates closed 8:00 pm to 7:00 am, printed permit required, and all fees are non-refundable.

Important Notices

Campground A CLOSED March 20-23, 2026 for a parks youth program.

Campground B remains open.

Campground A reopens Friday, March 27, 2026.

Campground A CLOSED March 6-7, 2026 for the annual Canoe Festival.

Expect heavier traffic. Campground B remains open.

Campground A is closed during summer.

Typically closes after Memorial Day and reopens Labor Day weekend.

Bathroom at Campground B is currently closed.

Bathroom across the parking lot is still available.
